Ein thematischer Spaziergang durch Religion und Sozialgeschichte – auf den Spuren der Bauwerke der Budapester Burg.

Begleiten Sie uns auf eine spannende Entdeckungsreise in die Jahrhunderte der Frühen Neuzeit! Wie lebten Christen, Juden und Muslime damals Seite an Seite in der Burg von Buda?

Unsere Tour gibt Einblicke in eine faszinierende Geschichte. Im 9. Jahrhundert besiedelten die ungarischen Stämme das Karpatenbecken. Mit der Krönung von König Stephan I. im Jahr 1000 begann die ungarische Staatlichkeit. 1526 wurde das Land durch die Eroberung des Osmanischen Reiches geteilt, und auch Buda geriet unter türkische Herrschaft. Erst 1686 wurde die Stadt befreit – und stand von da an unter habsburgischem Einfluss bis ins 20. Jahrhundert.



1. „City of Baths“ – Spa & wellness packages



Budapest, often called the “City of Baths,” is one of the few capitals in the world with over 100 natural springs and wells rich in minerals. Bathing traditions date back to Roman times and flourished during the Turkish era, reaching their golden age around the 19th–20th centuries. Iconic sites include the vast Széchenyi Bath, the Art Nouveau Gellért Bath, the historic Rudas Bath, and the healing Lukács Bath. The water is recommended for musculoskeletal and rheumatic conditions, while also serving as important social spaces. Today, Budapest’s baths combine history, healing, and modern wellness, making them essential experiences for visitors.

The Gellért Baths and the Rudas Baths are located in the immediate vicinity of the conference venue. The former is a 5-minute walk, while the latter is a 10-minute walk.

The Széchenyi Bath is simply unmissable. From the conference venue, you can take trams 47 or 49 to Deák Ferenc Square, and from there take the M1 metro (Europe's second metro line) to the Széchenyi Baths stop. This is an approx. 30-minute journey.

2. Hungarian Gastronomy, Wine Culture, and the World of Ruin Bars

Hungarian cuisine is known for its rich traditions and distinctive flavors, with iconic dishes such as goulash soup, fisherman's soup, Hortobágyi pancake, and stuffed cabbage. Modern gastronomy creatively reinterprets these classics, while famous desserts like strudel, Dobos cake, and chimney cake have gained international fame. Hungary's 22 wine regions add to its culinary richness, with Tokaj celebrated for its Tokaji Aszú (the king of wines, the wine of kings), Villány for its bold reds, and Eger for its Egri Bikavér. Wine tasting is an essential part of Hungarian hospitality, often paired with local cheeses and meats. In Budapest, ruin bars - creative venues set in abandoned buildings - embody the city's vibrant, eclectic urban culture, with Szimpla Kert standing as the most iconic example.


